### **TROWEL OR SLEDGEHAMMER?**

Do you know the story of Nehemiah? He was the cupbearer for a king. A cupbearer was the Old Testament word (as near as I can figure) for a wine steward. And old Nehemiah was a good one. The king Artaxerxes, (that's pronounced art-a-zerk-sees) not only valued Nehemiah's talent as a wine steward but had grown to listen to him and trust his counsel, and to have the ear of the King was a very fine thing indeed! But Nehemiah's heart was heavy because the walls of Jerusalem, his home town (so to speak), were in ruins, and he feared for the city. So with prayer and boldness he spoke to the King and received permission to go to Jerusalem and re-build the walls.

You see, Nehemiah was a builder. He knew that through the process of rebuilding the walls that not only would his city be made whole again, but that the effort would bring the people together and glorify God. He not only built up the crumbling walls of the city, but built up the Jews, his countrymen, at the same time. Nehemiah was a builder, and he answered God's call. But take in contrast to Nehemiah, our old friend Joshua! Everyone knows his story. How he fought the battle of Jericho and by following God's instructions was able to bring down the walls of the city and become victorious. Joshua was demolitions expert. He knew that by tearing down the walls of Jericho that he would win the battle and the purposes of God's plan would move forward. So you see even though Joshua tore things down, it was still for good, still for God's purpose.

So which one are you this morning? A builder or a demolitions expert? A trowel or a sledgehammer? Either? Both can be useful to God's purpose. If there are things that need doing, progress to be made for the Kingdom of God on earth, then those of us who are builders had better get out our trowels and get to work. But if there are things that are hindering God's Kingdom, then those of us with sledgehammers had better start swinging! Clearing the way for new life and new beginnings in the Kingdom of God. Just a note of caution for you sledgehammer types. Be careful that in your demolition of the things that hinder God's Kingdom that you don't tear down the things and people that are good. Remember, a little sledgehammer goes a long way!

Lord thank you for our diversity. For seeing the ways of man and knowing that it takes different people and different talents to complete the work You have set before us. Be with us this day. Give us the strength to complete Your work, and the wisdom to follow Your plans to the letter. We pray this in the name of Christ. Amen.
