

### Mark's Message

### THE PARABLE OF THE VINEYARD

I am reading the book of Luke this week for my New Testament reading and I came yesterday to the parable of the man who had a fig tree in his vineyard that did not bear fruit. (read Luke Chapter 13 vs.6-9) Now, we all know that Jesus often taught in parables. Some of them are very straight forward and clear, and others are not. The parable that I am speaking of this morning deserves further study because it is a wonderful lesson for our lives and a wonderful example of the love God has for us.

In the story the owner of a vineyard has a fig tree that has not put forth any fruit in three years. The owner had faithfully checked on the tree each spring to see if it would produce, but finally had grown frustrated at the tree's failure. So, in his frustration he goes to the steward of his vineyard (his farm manager) and says CUT THIS TREE DOWN!! It doesn't produce anything so it's not worth the soil it uses! But then comes the steward who says Yes, Lord, but let me tend, and water, and fertilize the tree for one more year. Then if it bears fruit, fine, if not we'll then cut it down.

What do you think that means? Well let's put ourselves in the story. In this parable we are the fig tree and Christ is the steward, and God is the owner of the vineyard. We are the tree that God comes to (with hope) time after time to see if we are bearing fruit for the Kingdom of God. God is the only one that has judgment over us. He alone determines if we are bearing fruit, and if the fruit we are bearing is worthy. But the parable also tells us that God's patience with us is not infinite, because our lives are not infinite. We only have this brief existence to serve God, to bear fruit, to be what we can be with Christ living in us. We, like the fig tree will eventually be cut down. The Bible says that the Lord increased King Solomon's days because he was righteous and asked for wisdom. Should God then not shorten our days if we live a fruitless life in iniquity?

But friends, we are also stewards with Christ. We are called by Christ to tend each other. We are called by Christ to seek out that brother or sister that is not bearing fruit, to tend them, to feed them with the Word of God, to lead them to the Water of Life, and to make sure they put down roots in the fertile soil of the family of God. So go forth this day and be fruitful. Be a good steward, and tend you're your brothers and sisters in Christ so they may be fruitful as well.

Almighty God, we know you are the vineyard owner and we are your servants. We know that you teach us in many ways. You show us that we can bear fruit, even after being barren for many years. That all things are possible with You in our lives. Lord make us fruitful in the Spirit and in works for Your Kingdom each day. We pray in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

# MVMW Mt. Vernon Methodist Women



### TO: ALL LADIES of the CHURCH

Our ladies have helped with the Backpack Program and are attending the Miller Methodist's last service on August 4<sup>th</sup>. We have had several joint meetings/lunches with these ladies and want to welcome them to join our MVMW.

Also, in August we are doing lunch with a couple of our ladies in Care Facilities. Watch for the dates and times.

We are also preparing for the Festival of Sharing Gathering in Republic on September 20-21. We've always done the

"Personal Hygiene Packs," but this year we decided to do the "MO Women's Prison Pack" which involves a \$10 donation for specific items which the Festival Office buys in bulk (cheaper & insures correct items). The second pack we picked is the "MO Paper Products Pack" which includes: 3 wrapped packages of toilet paper with 4 double rolls each; 2 rolls paper towels (good quality); and 2 (large rectangle boxes) facial tissue. I will put up a poster showing these 2 requests, and you may bring items and/or cash for the packs. These items need to be turned in by Sunday, September 8<sup>th</sup>, as we will pack them at our September 10<sup>th</sup> meeting.
