### CHILDISH THINGS

"Kids! What's the matter with kids today!?" Goes the line from a musical written more than 50 years ago. Seems not much has changed in the past half century. People are still asking the same question. So what's the answer? Just like yesterday, I think it can be distilled to a very simple answer. Too much society, not enough Jesus.

Now I don't mean to sound overly simplistic, I mean the six words in the sentence "Too much society, not enough Jesus" contain at least our of five whole sermons! Certainly kids today have problems and influences that you or I never even though about. I mean when you were in jr. high school, had you heard of crack cocaine? body piercing? kid's with tattoos? mass murder in high schools? cell phones? metal detectors? violent video games? terrorism attacks? .....me either. But yet this is the world in which our children are growing up. Too much society.

Have you watched television lately? The networks are promoting violence, sex, perversion, homosexuality, greed, avarice, and the lowest common denominator. And that's just in prime time on the major networks. We can't even talk about cable! Yet we pipe these images into our homes packaged in slick and stylish presentations that we watch but don't really see....and it creeps in....Too much society.

In the 13th Chapter of Corinthians Paul says this: "When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me." Paul is speaking of natural progression. Just as the speech and thoughts of a child might be seen as imperfect as they give way to adult speech and thought, our current way of worship and communion with Christ will be made perfect as He comes again in glory. This natural progression is certainly our goal as parents. We want our child to grow up in the right season and in the right time. Unfortunately, our society wants to make 12 year old little girls into 35 year old floozies! And 9 and 10 year old little boys into gun toting drug dealers. You might think I am being overly dramatic, but you'll have to admit it's true. Kid's aren't allowed anymore to make that natural progression. And they go willingly because they are searching for something to fill a void in their lives.... Not enough Jesus.

I heard a statistic the other day that only 6% of people living in apartments go to church. Six percent! Do you know how many children that represents? That means that 94% of the children who live there have never heard the good news. Never owned a Bible. Never stood in a children's choir and sang "Jesus Loves Me"....Not enough Jesus.

So what do we do? Again I'll go back to Paul. Love is the most excellent way. If you love your children get them in church! Even if they sleep through the service it beats the alternative. Now if you are a parent that requires their children to attend church...God bless you! But be sure that you make that commitment a 7 day a week event. Don't raise a generation of "Sunday Morning Christians". The Bible says that if you bring up a child in the way he should go, when he is old he will not depart from it. They will live YOUR example. (That'll wake you up in the middle of the night!) The example YOU SET will be how they live.

It's time for us as Christian parents to put away childish things. Stop letting the world dictate how our children will live and act and dress. Live the example for your child. Bring them up in a Biblical household. Love them through all things. Set their feet on the right path. Give them the gift of your faith.

Lord help us to raise our children as you would have it. Be our Rock and our Refuge when we have to make hard decisions on their behalf. Help us to put away childish things and love up to our responsibility as parents. Help us to love them as you love them Father. We pray in Jesus' name. Amen.
