We often hear about the "ages". You know, the Iron Age, or the Golden Age, or even the "Space Age". But if we had to name the "age" we're living in just now, I think we would call it the "Age of Convenience", because we want everything to be easy. Right? We have drive through windows, ATMs, one hour photo, on-line banking, gift cards (so we don't have to pick out a present!), remote control, and on and on! If we don't have to get out of our car or our chair, if it doesn't require any real effort on our part....then count us in!!

This "Age" has even extended into our churches. Some churches have one service for this group and another for that group. We have 3 or 4 services on Sunday morning so that everyone can find a service that's convenient......

"Football comes on at noon today pastor! You can't expect me to miss the first quarter!"

"Well, we like to attend the early services that way we can brunch with our friends that don't attend church"

"Sunday night services! You've got to be kidding! That's my time!!"

Consider with me, for a moment, that maybe it shouldn't be so easy. Maybe making an effort or a sacrifice to attend worship or to live a Christian life is not an inconvenience...maybe it's essential. You see when Jesus talked about living the way we should live he used terms like "the narrow gate", and when he preached about service he said "the harvest is great, but the workers are few". Maybe I'm missing something, but to me it doesn't sound like He's saying "Oh, just follow Me and everything's going to be a breeze!"

Maybe it shouldn't be so easy. Are we being roped into what society would have us do rather than what we should be doing? Are we modeling our Christian walk after the secular world? Are we making Christianity a religion of convenience? Please understand that I am not speaking against having multiple services or programs at your church. What I am saying is that perhaps each of us should look at our own motives, our own heart, our own worship. Are we there because it's convenient? Or because our hearts cry out to worship Him? Are we there because it's convenient, or because we have a heart for service? Are we there because of habit, or have we come to praise God?

I would encourage each of you to examine your hearts. Is your Christian walk a walk of convenience, or of service? Is your Christian walk a meandering stroll, or a walk of purpose? Food for thought today.

Lord help us to walk with purpose in Your will. We want to have a heart for true worship and praise. We want to live a life of sacrifice and service for You. Help us to avoid the pitfalls of the broad and easy way Father. We pray in Jesus name. Amen.
