

Mark's Message

What if we did a little experiment at church? Picked a random sampling of people over the next few Sundays and ask them this question: Why are you here this morning?

Here are some of the responses I believe you'll get:

Huh?
I'm here every Sunday.
My husband/wife/parent made me come
I teach Sunday School
I'm one of the musicians
It's Christmas/Easter
We're having a pot luck after church!
We're visiting
I serve on the church board/committee
It's raining. We couldn't go______

Why do you come to church? Notice anything about that list? No one in my imaginary list said "I came to worship", no one said "To glorify God".

In his book "The Purpose Driven Life" Rick Warren says...."Worship is our first responsibility to God....God wants our worship to be motivated by love, thanksgiving, and delight. Not duty."

Being in a community of believers is important. However, we should be careful that our church going does not turn

into just a habit. You are there for a reason. And here's the important part. IT'S NOT ABOUT YOU. It's about God. It's about worship and praise, about letting go, confessing sin, giving glory to God, using your talents to lift Him up. It's not about you. It's not about your preacher, your Sunday school teacher, your position in the church, or anything else you can think of contains the word you or your. It's about God. So if you're reading this, and you think I might be right. How will it change the way you think about worship? What will you DO differently. How will you think differently?

Because if you do think these things are true, but then just say to yourself "Boy, I'm glad he's not talking about me!" you've missed something. Go ahead, conduct the experiment. Let me know what you find.

Heavenly Father, just like the song says, help us to get back to the heart of worship. It's all about You Jesus. We love you so much Lord. Help us to put away our foolish pride and any sense of embarrassment we have about worshiping You openly and freely. Help us to glorify You all the more in everything we do. We pray in Jesus' name.
