A Note From Pastor Donnie

Dear Church Family,

Heat Advisory.

I've seen that term on my weather app several times this week. In the context of weather, a Heat Advisory is a cautionary statement. The Bible, however, uses heat to illustrate a healthy state of the Church and individual believers within the church. Could the Mt. Vernon United Methodist Church legitimately place a "heat advisory" sign at the entrance of the church? Do you know anyone in our church who could wear a T-shirt with the saying "heat advisory - on fire for Jesus"?

There is a quote commonly attributed to John Wesley that says, "I set myself on fire and people come from miles to watch me burn", which, actually, is not found in any of John Wesley's published works. Nevertheless, I like it! Let's set ourselves on fire with the love of God!

John the Baptist prophesied that one is coming who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire (Luke 3:16). On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came in the form of tongues of fire resting on the followers of Jesus symbolizing the very presence and power of God (Acts 2). In Zechariah 13 God is a refiner who brings the Israelites through the fire in order to refine them as silver is refined. The fire of sacrifice was described as "a soothing aroma to the Lord" in Leviticus 23 and Numbers 28. God spoke to Moses through a burning bush (Exodus 3:2) and protected the Israelites during the Exodus with a wall of fire at night (Exodus 40:38). King David wrote in Psalms 39:3, "my heart grew hot within me. While I meditated, the fire burned; then I spoke with my tongue:"

So, when a Christian says, "I'm on fire", he or she is saying that the presence of God is emanating from them, that they are listening to the voice of God, that they are under the protection of God, and that they demonstrate the power of God in their lives.

... Or that they are excited to be a Christian!




Planting seeds in faith
